- This program helps students gain expertise that can meet the state standards for their specific teaching position.

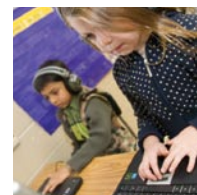
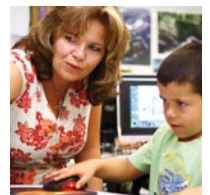
Skill Sets Learned

- Installing and running a software system into an old Windows-based computer.

- Create classroom assessment tools using a variety of technologies.
- Teacher training in Remote Response Systems—Quizdom, Promethius, Activos.
- Grant writing.
- Create engaging and compelling presentations rich in images, sounds, animations, and movies.
